
Our priority is our volunteers and clients. I recognise our remarkable volunteers who ensure our people continue to be helped. My own illnesses have meant extra work for the few. I must repeat my comments once again. I speak of Tricia McGill, Ian George, Peggy Stocks, Klaus Jungling and Sarah Wilson. Together with Amanda Lewis our treasurer, this small group pitched in to make continuity of the programme happen. We cannot stress how much we appreciate their dedication and contribution.

We started over 20 years ago as a low cost communication programme with outdated equipment and lots of hope and endeavour for people with limited spending capability. From day 1 to now to help those who are housebound physically disabled to be part of community using technology and computers. Today Beyond Disability provides heavily subsidised interactive communication including modern fully maintained computers and software to those in our community who cannot get to their local library because of mobility disability issues, and also for their carers. We also try to assist Vets with PTSD and their carers. Our members have access to programmes to visually speak to family and friends. They also have access to the biggest library in the world. It's an easy place to get education, to shop, to bank, sometimes to just have fun and contact family anywhere in the world for nominal cost.

We continue to have long-term support from Mornington, Casey and Frankston councils and Bendigo bank. This support is invaluable to meeting running costs and for longevity. We continue to maintain a strong bank balance which on occasion is often to our disadvantage. Potential funders seem not to acknowledge that much of our funds is for future commitments for wireless broadband and expensive communication aids. As the program grows and in order to ensure we can meet our obligations we have placed funds on one and two year term deposit with the bank. Unfortunately, grantees see this as us having plenty of money and not the fact that it is for broadband and upgrades now and in the future.

This was another low year for fundraising and we had rejections. We managed only \$13,888 (\$23,126) and this was only due to the longstanding support of Mornington, Casey and Frankston councils and Bendigo Bank. Against this total expenses of \$39,825 (\$39,699).

On behalf of your committee, we extend our appreciation to all our volunteers for their contribution and I personally thank the committee for covering my absences. I commend this program to you and warmly suggest that whenever you have an opportunity that you kindly acknowledge our volunteers. It is amazing how a simple thank you can bring a smile.

**Treasurer's report 30<sup>th</sup> of June 2019**

Closing bank balance at the end of the 2019 financial year was \$140,228.21 (\$160,584.33).

We note again that BDI raised only \$13,888 (\$23,126) against expenditure of \$39,825 (\$39,699). Thankfully due to a past generous benefactor, a significant portion of funds currently held is to provide modern broadband capable equipment and to fund wireless broadband for our clients. With nearly all our clients onto a bank debit system, together with reduced entertainment guide sales and fewer donations, client fundraising was \$5,508(\$11,620), donations and grants totalled \$8,830 (\$11,506) and reflects the long term support of our three councils – Mornington Peninsula, Casey and Frankston. Beyond Disability particularly values the support of Mornington Peninsula Shire annual grant and Bendigo Bank Community Fund. Management of our funds through the cash management account achieved interest of \$5,801 (\$6,240) in a very low interest market and this helped offset our \$20,135 (\$10,333) deficit together with funds already "earmarked" to meet the increased technology/broadband costs.


Funds have been placed into one and two year bank term deposits to meet future broadband and technology costs.

We continue to benefit from our membership with Connecting Up (Donor Tech) where we can obtain heavily subsidised software. This allowed us to provide Windows 10 operating system and office on our current issue of computers.

Expenses for the year were \$39,825 (\$39,699). Again our largest expenses were in the areas of technology and totalled \$28,796 (\$29,564). Business expenses for the financial year again totalled \$2,538 (\$2,520). Volunteer reimbursements which were mainly for travel, meetings and training reimbursements totalled \$5,403 (\$5,968).

We continue to maintain AON volunteer insurance package which has been constructed for community volunteer groups and we also have a separate committee insurance cover underwritten by Lloyds.

We acknowledge the support of LBW Advisory, our auditor.



## **Report on the Audit of the Financial Report**

### **Opinion**

We have audited the financial report of Beyond Disability Inc. (the association), which comprises the Statement by Members of the Committee, Income and Expenditure Statement, Balance Sheet as at 30 June 2019, a summary of significant accounting policies and the certification by members of the committee on the annual statements giving a true and fair view of the financial position and performance of the association.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial report presents fairly, in all material respects, the financial position of the association as at 30 June 2019 and [of] its financial performance for the year then ended in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial statements and the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1991.

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the association in accordance with the ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional Accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

### **Emphasis of Matter – Basis of Accounting**

We draw attention to Note 1 to the financial report, which describes the basis of accounting. The financial report has been prepared to assist the association to meet the requirements of Associations Incorporation Act 1991. As a result, the financial report may not be suitable for another purpose. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

### **Responsibilities of the Committee for the Financial Report**

The committee is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial report in accordance with the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 1991 and for such internal control as the committee determines is necessary to enable the preparation and fair presentation of a financial report that is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial report, the committee is responsible for assessing the association's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless the committee either intends to liquidate the association or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so.

Messages from our volunteers.



Thanks again for the chance to offer a few of my thoughts for the year. There has not been much success in finding new clients even with the best efforts of the committee. It seems the climate of computing is changing with people using cheaper mobile phones/tablets and mobile plans and the roll out of the NBN. So as mentioned last year, it has been a year of looking after our existing clients.

Working with Klaus and Richard we have consolidated our stock of computer equipment which is now securely stored at Klaus and my place and we disposed of all our obsolete equipment.

We still have a healthy stock of machines with Windows 10 ready to go and easy to connect to the next generation of Telstra Mobile Broadband WiFi modems. We have received from Telstra recently the new WiFi modems to replace all our ageing Bigpond modems which we plan to change over shortly.

There is still 'work in progress' in designing our new Website which has however presented some challenges that we need to work through.

The NBN rollout is continuing in our area and with NBNCO's target to complete the rollout by 2020 this will mean more and more of our area will have access to the new network. Plans still around the \$30 to \$40/month for a basic data plan.
